+ NEW TESTAMENT READING

Mark 9:46-52 (ESV)

Jesus Heals Blind Bartimaeus

Pastor: And now friends, a reading from the Gospel of Mark.

Listen and hear the Word of God:

Lector: Children of God and friends of Christ, hear these words from the prophet Isaiah:

¹ Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. 2 Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen diligently to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. ³ Incline your ear, and come to me; hear, that your soul may live; and I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. ⁴ Behold, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. ⁵ Behold, you shall call a nation that you do not know, and a nation that did not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, and of the Holy One of Israel, for He has glorified you.

⁶ "Seek the LORD while He may be found; call upon Him while He is near; ⁷ Let the wicked forsake their ways and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them turn to the LORD, and He will have mercy on them, and to our God, for He will freely pardon.

Lector: This is the Word of God for you, the people of God!

⁴⁶ Then Jesus and His Disciples came to Jericho, and as they left the city with a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. ⁴⁷ And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁸ And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But then he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" 49 Then Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart. Get up; He is calling you." ⁵⁰ Then throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ And Jesus said to him, "What do you want Me to do for you?" And the blind man said to Him, "Rabbi, let me recover my sight." 52 Then Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he recovered his sight and followed Jesus on the way.
