<sup>\*</sup> The word <u>catholic</u> means "universal" or "for all people" (not the Roman Catholic Church).

Elder: Children of God and friends of Christ, hear these words from the letter of James:

<sup>19</sup> Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; <sup>20</sup> for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. <sup>21</sup> Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.

<sup>22</sup> But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. <sup>23</sup> For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. <sup>24</sup> For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. <sup>25</sup> But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

<sup>26</sup> If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. <sup>27</sup> Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.

## NEW TESTAMENT READING

Mathew 25:14-21; 24-29 (ESV)

The Parable of the Talents

Elder: And now friends, a reading from the parables of Jesus.

Listen and hear the Word of God:

<sup>14</sup> A master called three servants and entrusted them with money. <sup>15</sup> To one he gave five talents, to another he gave give two, to another he gave one, and then he went away. <sup>16</sup> The servant who had five talents traded them, and made five more. <sup>17</sup> The servant who had two talents traded them, and made two more. <sup>18</sup> But the servant with one talent dug a hole and buried it, and did nothing with what the master had given. <sup>19</sup> Now when the master returned, he called the servants before him <sup>20</sup> and to the first two he rewarded them for doubling their talents. <sup>21</sup> "Well done, good and faithful servants", he said, "You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master."

<sup>24</sup> But when he questioned the servant with one talent he heard, "Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, <sup>25</sup> so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you have what is yours." <sup>26</sup> Then the master answered him, "You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed? <sup>27</sup> You ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was mine with interest. <sup>28</sup> So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents. <sup>29</sup> For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away."
